ISAIAH 50:5B, MOSIAH 14:15 (12-16)

(GT)

Isaiah 50

~~WHO IS THERE THAT...~~

WHERE IS ...?

WHICH IS ...?

These questions in Hebrew are an implication that no such thing, person, or place exists.

50:1,8,9

Ch. 50 - introduces idea of the suffering servant

(50:6) I gave my back to the smiters - (Isaiah/prophet)  
my cheeks to them that plucked off the hair of Israel?  
I hid not my face from shame and spitting

Ch 51

Look at what I did for Abraham! I will make also your waste places fertile earthly things will pass away but my salvation is forever  
9-10 even the Gods of the wicked will destroy

17-suffering servant - you have drunk the cup of wrath

22-cup will now be drunk by your tormentors → this is why the kings of the earth will say Israel bore their sins

52 → Jerusalem's blessed state in the day of the Lord

v. 7 → ~~not~~ the messenger (gospel), prophets, Jesus

v. 4 → Egypt, you chose to go into, Assyria took you by force, now you're captive in "Babylon," but I'll bring you out without money too

v. 7-12 beginning of salvation of God

1st fulfillment was the Persians allowing Jews to return & rebuild Temple

v. 13-15 suffering servant again —

sprinkle → Hiphil → causative → he shall cause nations to leap (in surprise)

Ch 53-continuation

v. 1-11 kings of the world (ch. 52 v. 15) are talking?

v. 12 Yahweh talking

53:1 implication no one believes them or sees God's Hand

50:2 By my rebuke I dry up the sea  
make the rivers a desert

51:9-10 Was it not you who cut Rahab in pieces, who pierced the dragon? Was it not you who dried up the sea? made the depths a way for ransomed to pass dragon, sea, deep, Leviathan,  
these are deities of people nearby  
v. 15 → I divided the sea  
Leviathan, Rahab, etc. = chaos = ongoing "creation" i.e. victory of order

control of the waters is God's primordial power.

f. Jesus calming storm, walking on water

sea = Enki or "Ea" Sumerian god of the deep (from lesson on Jonah)  
deep represents death, so god is foreshadowing his conquering of sin & death

Enki created man, caused flood, confused languages

Read Ch 52-53 twice

first reading - Israel is suffering servant.

this is Old Testament (and modern Jewish) perspective  
aligns with Antecedents 1&2

Second reading

→ we have an inspired commentary on Isaiah 52-53 in Mosiah  
it begins with Abinadi discussing 52:7 and then he recites the  
10 commandments & Isaiah 53 from memory. He says explicitly  
these chapters are talking about Christ—and explains how.

Read Mosiah #12-16 after reading Ch 52.

explains how this is a passage completely dominated by  
the 3<sup>rd</sup> antecedent

All of what will happen to Jesus is summed up in Mosiah 13:28, 34, 35

which is correct? Why not both?

Messiah excerpts:

38 52:7 How Beautiful are the feet (and)

23 53:3 He was despised

24 53:4-5 Surely

25 53:5 And with his stripes

26 53:6 All we like sheep (begin)

talk about word painting in #26 and in #3 (every valley shall be exalted)  
ch. 40:4

"good news" in Ch 52.v.7 is actually a "good messenger" (mabbasser)

or antecedent or this is a metaphor for:

Abinadi tells us the fulfilment of this is:

all the prophets

40:9-11

those who are still publishing peace

52:7

those who will henceforth publish peace

61:1-2 (liberty to the captives)

Jesus himself, the ~~founder~~ of peace

Evangelium

Mosiah 15:14-18

So, when you are publishing the peace that comes from Jesus, you are the gospel, in the original  
sense of the word
