Alma 5: One of the great motivational chapters for latter-day Saints  
Also an admonition & reproof for wayward believers. Why?

Delivered forebears from: captivity and sin

sin is the real deliverance, liberation from earthly  
captivity is a symbol that God can forgive sin

Jesus taught the same thing: by healing (Matt 9:6)

So, we remember God's deliverance of our forebears so we will believe  
in his statement.

word → change → humility → trust → endurance

\* change leads us to believe in the day of judgment  
and hope for mercy when it comes

5:26 "can ye feel so now?"

The way to "feel so now" is to continue to

- vv. 27-30 {  
a) remember the day of judgment  
b) sufficiently humble/stripped of pride  
c) stripped of envy  
d) refrain from mocking

- 54-55 {  
e) refrain from persecuting believers  
f) share substance with the poor

V. 38 God calls you by his own name

Jehovah → "he will cause to become"  
if you can't answer to this name,  
how can he change you?

39-41 dichotomy between following God & the devil

v. 62 (v 34)

ch. 7 these are words to faithful saints  
not as much about change → rejoicing in Christ  
testifies of his mortal ministry & statement

v. 19 "ye are making his paths straight"

These are the actions of subjects preparing for  
the arrival of their King

Read vv. 23-24. These are the real messages for the  
faithful, & sum up what you need to know

One of these messages is for faithful saints, the other for wayward.  
Good spiritual barometer → which of these two kinds of messages  
so, am I noticing more/resonates with me?

from Ch. 5 choose the right narrative

from Ch. 7 If have faith, then hope, then charity, then you will  
be blessed to abound in good works
